COMPUTER AREA

When a child works with a computer, he/she:

- → develops an enjoyment of literacy through electronic books
- → practices letters and words with programs that matches pictures to beginning letters
- → develops listening skills with interactive software
- → learns number concepts, patterns, measurement, etc through specific software
- → matches letters in his/her name with keyboard letters
- → uses technology as a part of the day to day learning process
- → learns how to use a mouse to move items on a screen
- → learns how to advance through programs
- → develops independence as he/she learns computer skills

You can help as a volunteer by:

- → helping children type letters in his/her name
- → helping children use the mouse
- → asking questions that guide children toward independence
- → helping children advance through programs
- → noticing when children hear sounds from the computer, software or printer and what the sounds mean
- → noticing what happens when the Enter/Return key is pressed
- → helping children find answers to questions they may have from other areas in the classroom
