## DRAMATIC PLAY AREA

## When a child works in the House Area, he/she:

- → learns what the roles of mothers, fathers and children are.
- → understand what it feels like to play at being someone else.
- → learns how to use imagination.
- → learns to cooperate with other children.
- increases his/her ability to communicate with others about personally meaningful experiences.
- imitates and describes sounds from the environment.
- → pantomimes actions such as cooking and vacuuming.

## You can help as a volunteer by:

- → joining the children in their make-believe.
- → encouraging children to try new characters. Boys can take care of babies and girls can be detectives. Children can become doctors, mommies, super-heroes, astronauts, and whatever they can dream up.
- → pretending with the children and using your imagination.
- introducing the children to the puppets in the house area. Puppets are often a valuable tool for building communication skills and the release of inner thoughts and emotions.
- relaxing and enjoying yourself in this not so make-believe world!
