## OUTDOOR AREA

When a child works in the Outdoor Area, he/she:

- learns how to use his/her body effectively.
$\rightarrow$ experiences joy in achieving a skill.
$\rightarrow$ finds fun and relaxation in bodily movement.
- learns the limitations of his/her body.
- learns safety and caution.
. $\rightarrow$ learns to take turns and to share a piece of equipment.
$\rightarrow$ develops vocabulary words such as "over" and "under".
$\rightarrow$ gains experience using large muscles.
$\rightarrow$ represents experiences through dramatic play.
$\rightarrow$ observes and describes weather changes.
$\rightarrow$ explores the natural environment.


## You can help as a volunteer by:

$\rightarrow$ joining the children in their play.
$\rightarrow$ teaching children to "pump" on the swings so that they can swing themselves.

- helping children remember the safety rules for the equipment and outdoors area.
$\rightarrow$ encouraging children to use words like "high" and "low", "fast" and "slow", "over" and "under", and "soft" and "hard".
$\rightarrow$ being the extra eyes that are needed to supervise children outside.
