SAND AND WATER AREA

When a child works in the Sand and Water Area, he/she:

- ightharpoonup finds it soothing to bury his/her hands in sand or pour water in and out of cups.
- is able to relax with this media and center attention on a task.
- has an opportunity to play alone and not have to compete with other children as with some activities. This is especially important to a child who has trouble getting alone with friends.
- → has a great opportunity to learn about size and measurement by experimenting with measuring spoons, cups and different size containers.
- → learns which kinds of things float in water.
- ⇒ is not concerned with a final product, so he/she does not find it frustrating.
- → explores actively the attributes and functions of materials with all of the senses.
- transforms and combines materials.

You can help as a volunteer by:

- making sure children have washed their hands before and after playing at the table.
- → helping children put on smocks.
- → encouraging children to experiment with measurement.
- helping increase vocabulary by using words like "full", "empty", "wet", and "dry".
- → encouraging sharing the materials.
